Dear Parents,

As many will be aware, the NSW Government has released information about return to school arrangements for Government schools over the past few days from the beginning of Week Three of Term Two. I am writing to advise of the plans that we are making for the coming term to assist with your planning.

From the beginning of this term, we will be continuing our remote online learning program for all Year Levels, commencing on Tuesday 28 April. During this time, we will also be continuing to provide at College supervision for those who require this ongoing supervision as was provided during the final weeks of Term One. Students participating in this supervision will be undertaking the same online lessons as those who are remotely accessing these lessons and will be supervised by support staff.

We will also be looking to invite small groups of Year Twelve students to work on their HSC Major Work projects with their teachers during the first two weeks of term.

From Week Three (Week beginning 11 May), Year Twelve students will be returning full-time to their regular timetable and Year Eleven, Kindergarten and Year One will be returning on a part-time basis. The actual days that they will be attending will be communicated in the coming week. All other Year Groups will attend one day during that week on a rostered basis. For the days that students are not attending school, they will continue with their remote learning program.

During Term Two, provided that there are no further unfavourable developments with regard to the broader community constraints related to COVID-19, we will be gradually increasing the on-site attendance days for all students. It must be noted that these plans could change rapidly if the broader community situation deteriorates. We will be providing regular communications about the reintroduction of on-site classes.

The NSW Government has expressed concern about parent presence within school sites, so this will have to be very carefully monitored over the coming term particularly. When dropping off and collecting children, we will be requiring the use of our pick up and drop off zones only. Further information about these processes will be provided over the coming weeks.

Our teachers are very keen to be reunited with their classes, and I am sure that students are keen to re-engage with their teachers and their friends at school.
